- Axolotls are most commonly found in Lake Xochimilco
- They were found in many lakes near Mexico City

- They are found in high altitude bodies of water



Foods

- Axolotls are carnivorous
- They locate food by smell
- Axolotls consume small prey
- Mollusks, worms, insects, arthropods, and small fish are the most common prey for Axolotls



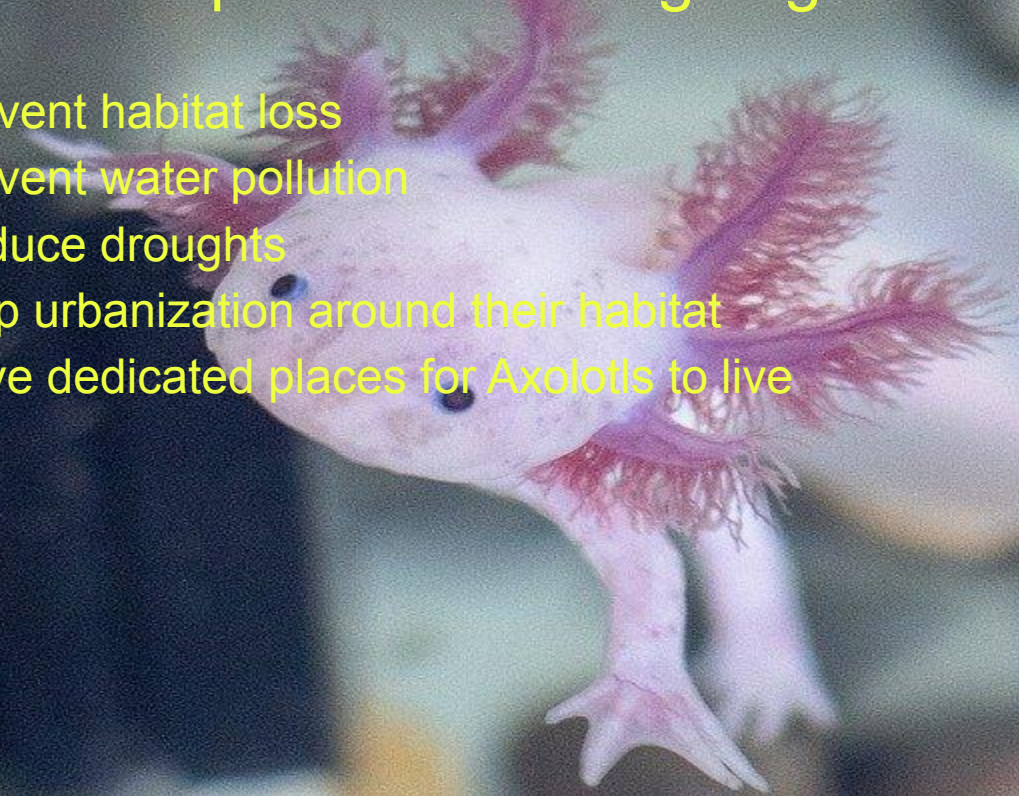
Why it is endangered

- Urbanization
- Water pollution
- Droughts
- Waste water disposal
- Introduction of invasive species like tilapia and perch



How we can prevent it from going extinct

- Prevent habitat loss
- Prevent water pollution
- Reduce droughts
- Stop urbanization around their habitat
- Have dedicated places for Axolotls to live



Population

- 50-1000 adults individuals in the wild
- They are popular pets
- Axolotls are critically endangered
