

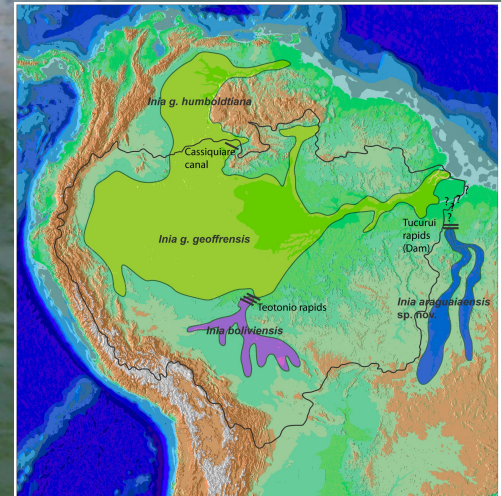
Pink river dolphins

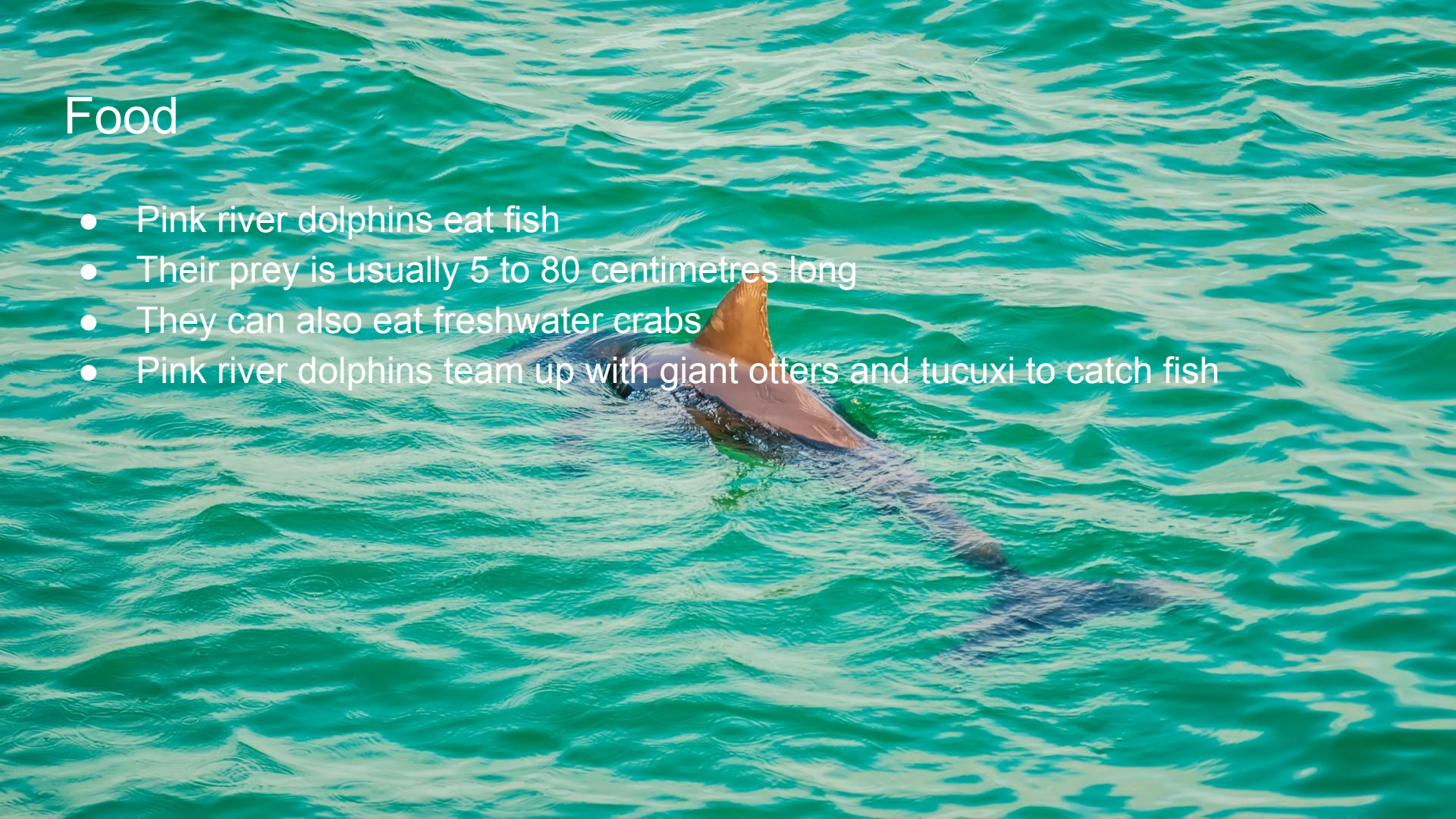
Habitat

- Pink river dolphins live in northern South America
- They live in the Amazon River, Orinoco River, Araguaia River, and Tocantins River
- The Pink River dolphins live in freshwater habitat
- They are usually found in the Amazon rainforest



Food

- Pink river dolphins eat fish
- Their prey is usually 5 to 80 centimetres long
- They can also eat freshwater crabs
- Pink river dolphins team up with giant otters and tucuxi to catch fish



Why Pink river dolphins are endangered

- Pink river dolphins are hunted for bait
- They are also left abandoned in nets so they exhaust themselves
- Fisherman overfish the Amazon river
- The abundance of fish lures the Pink river dolphins in a Várzea forest where floods occur



How can we prevent Pink river dolphins from being extinct

- We can stop hunting them
- We can help Pink river dolphins out of fishing nets
- We can stop overfishing
- We can direct fishies to other places other than Várzea forests



Population

- There are only five species of Pink river dolphins left in the wild
- In a study, 332 dolphins were spotted between the cities of Manaus and Tabatinga
- 345 dolphins were spotted on 120 km of river
