




Amur leopard

Habitat

- Amur Leopards live in southeastern Russia and northeastern China
- They are native to the Primorsky Region
- These leopards are found in forests



Food

- Amur Leopards are carnivorous
- They eat Deer
- They also eat Bore
- And many Rodents



Why Amur Leopards are endangered

- Amur Leopards were poached
- Their habitat became smaller and smaller
- We hunted them
- They became endangered in 1996

- Around 90 adult Amur Leopards are left in the wild
- 170-180 Amur Leopards live in captivity
